No. MSTET/11-2 / It is hereby notified for information of all the eligible candidates and Government school teachers that, the Board of Secondary Education, Manipur is conducting Teacher Eligibility Test (TET), 2022.

The Board of Secondary Education, Manipur will be conducting the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET), 2022 for all the eligible candidates and Government school teachers together as per convey approval letter no. SM3-501/1/2022-EDN(S)-EDN(S) dt. 14/11/2022 of the Govt. of Manipur, Secretariat: Education(S) Department and vide letter No. 12(HC)/104/2019-SE(S)PT dt. 10th November, 2022 Secretatiat: Education (S) Department addressed to the Director of Education (S), Manipur for Classes I to VIII and the test will be conducted in 15 (fifteen) languages.

Scheme of Examination

- Paper I: (150 marks). For those who want to become teacher for classes I to V (Primary Teacher) Time duration for the Test/Exam. shall be 2.30 hrs/150 Minutes.
 There will be 5 (five) sections carrying 30 marks each of Multiple Choice Question only.
 - i) Child development and pedagogy.
 - Language I (English).
 - Language II (MIL one from amongst the Languages listed in the Application Form OR Language II (English II)
 - iv) Mathematics.
 - v) Environmental Studies.
- 2. Paper II: (150 marks). For those who want to become teacher for classes VI to VIII (Upper Primary Teacher). *Time duration for the Test/Exam. shall be 2.30 hrs/150 minutes*.

There will be 4 (four) sections of Multiple Choice Question only,

- Child development and pedagogy (compulsory) 30 marks.
- i) Language I (English) (compulsory) 30 marks.
- Language II (MIL) one from amongst the Languages listed in the Application Form OR Language II (English II) - (compulsory) 30 marks.
- iv) (a) For Mathematics and Science Teacher
 Mathematics and Science 60 marks of MCQ (1 mark each).
 - (b) For Social Science Teacher Social Science 60 marks of MCQ (1 mark each).
 - (c) For any other teacher either (a) or (b) above.

There will be two tests held, Paper I and Paper II, on the same day, one in the morning and the other in the evening. Those interested in teaching from classes I to VIII will have to appear and qualify in both the papers (Paper I and Paper II).

The pass mark is 60% for general candidates and 50% for OBC, ST, SC and Physically challenged candidates.

GUIDELINES FOR TEACHER ELIGIBILITY TEST (TET)

In accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 23 of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009, which has been implemented in Manipur, the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) had vide Notification dated 23rd August, 2010, laid down the minimum qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in classes I to VIII. It had been inter alia provided that one of the essential qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in any of the schools referred to in clause (n) of section 2 of the RTE Act is that he/ she should pass the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) which will be conducted by the Board of Secondary Education, Manipur, in accordance with the Guidelines framed by the NCTE.

The rationale for including the TET as a minimum qualification for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher is as under:

- i) It would bring national standards and benchmark of teacher quality in the recruitment process;
- ii) It would induce teacher education institutions and students from these institutions to further improve their performance standards;
- iii) It would send a positive signal to all stakeholders that the Government lays special emphasis on teacher quality

NATURE AND STANDARD OF TET QUESTIONS:

The test items on Child Development and Pedagogy will focus on educational psychology of teaching and learning, relevant to the age group 11-14 years. They will focus on understanding the characteristics, needs and psychology of diverse learners, interaction with learners and the attributes and qualities of a good facilitator of learning.

The test items for Language I will focus on the proficiency related to the medium of instruction, as chosen from list of prescribed options in the application form.

The Language II will be a language other than Language I. A candidate may choose any one language from among the available options and as in the specified list in the application form and attempt questions in the one indicated by the candidate in the application form by him. The Test items in Language II will also focus on the elements of language, communication and comprehension abilities.

The test items in Mathematics and Science, and Social Studies/Social Science will focus on the concepts, problem solving abilities etc. The test items of Mathematics and Science will be of 30 marks each. The test items will be evenly distributed over different divisions of the syllabus of that subject as prescribed for classes VI-VIII by the Board.

The questions in the tests for Paper II will be based on the topics of the prescribed syllabus of the Board of Secondary Education, Manipur for classes VI-VIII but their difficulty standard as well as linkages could be up to the senior secondary stage.

The minimum qualifications for appearing in the test (TET), date for issue and submission of Application Forms, Examination date, fees etc. will be notified shortly.

FREQUENCY OF CONDUCT OF TET AND VALIDITY PERIOD OF THE CERTIFICATE:

The test will be held every year and as per NCTE order No. NCTE-Reg1011/78/2020-US(Regulation)-HQ/99954-99992 dated 09.06.2021, the validity period for TET qualifying certificate will remain valid for life. There will be no restriction on the number of attempts a person can take for acquiring the TET certificate. A person who has qualified TET may also appear again for improving his/her score. However, qualifying the TET would not confer a right on any person for recruitment/employment as it is only one of the eligibility criteria for appointment.

TET Exam Pattern:

The TET is being held for finding teacher eligibility for teaching two groups of students:

- One has to appear Paper I if he/she wants to teach in Class I-V.
- ii) One has to appear Paper II if he/she wants to teach in Class VI-VIII.
- iii) One has to appear both Paper I and Paper II if he/she wants to teach in Class I-VIII.

One has to obtain minimum 60% marks for general candidates and 50% for OBC, ST, SC and Physically Challenged candidates in these papers to qualify in TET, following which TET certificate would be given which will be valid for 7 years.

There is no restriction to the number of times one can appear in TET - also even after getting 60+% marks or 50+% marks noted above, one can appear in TET again to know his/her score.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

The following persons are eligible for appearing in the TET, 2022.

Minimum Qualifications for becoming Teachers for Classes I - V (Primary Stage):

- Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 2 year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known). OR
- Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 45% marks and 2 year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known) in accordance with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure), Regulations, 2002. OR
- iii. Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 4 years Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed.). OR
- iv. Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 2 year Diploma in Education (Special Education). OR
- Graduation and two-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known) OR
- vi. Graduation with at least 50% marks and Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.)
 OR
- vii. Post Graduation with a minimum 55% marks or equivalent grade and three-year integrated B.Ed-M.Ed.

Note: A person who is pursuing/admitted to any of the Teacher Education Courses (e.g. D.El.Ed, B.Ed, B.El.Ed, B.Ed-M.Ed. etc) shall be eligible for appearing in the TET Paper-I provided that his/her TET certificate shall be valid only on passing the examination of the aforesaid Teacher Education Courses.

Minimum Educational Qualifications for becoming Teacher for Classes VI - VIII (Upper Primary Stage).

- Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 4 year Bachelor in Elementary Education (B.El. Ed.). OR
- Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 4 year B.A./B.Sc. Ed. or . B.A.Ed./B.Sc.Ed. or Graduation with at least 50% marks and 1 Year B.Ed. (Special Education).
- Graduation and 2 year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known). OR

- iv. Graduation with at least 50% marks and 1 year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed.). OR
- V. Graduation with at least 45% marks and 1 year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed.), in accordance with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulation issued from time to time in this regard. OR
- vi. Post Graduation with a minimum 55% marks or equivalent grade and three year integrated B.Ed M.Ed.

Note: A person who is pursuing/admitted to any of the Teacher Education Courses (e.g. D.El.Ed, B.Ed, B.El.Ed, B.Ed-M.Ed. etc) shall be eligible for appearing in the TET Paper-II provided that his/her TET certificate shall be valid only on passing the examination of the aforesaid Teacher Education Courses.

The candidate not having any of the above qualification shall not be eligible for appearing in Teacher Eligibility Test (TET).

The candidate should satisfy his /her eligibility before applying and shall be personally responsible in case he/she is not eligible to apply as per the given eligibility criteria.

Note:

- Relaxation up to 5% in the qualifying marks in the minimum Educational Qualification for eligibility shall be allowed to the candidates belonging to reserved categories, such as SC/ST/OBC/ Differently abled.
- Diploma/Degree Course in Teacher Education: For the purposes of this Notification, a Diploma/Degree course in teacher education recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) only shall be considered. However, in case of Diploma in Education (Special Education) and B.Ed. (Special Education), a course recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) only shall be considered.
- 3. The minimum qualifications referred above apply to teachers of Languages, Social Studies/Social Science, Mathematics, Science etc. In respect of teachers for Physical Education, the minimum qualification norms for Physical Education teachers referred to in NCTE Regulation, dated 3rd November, 2001 (as amended from time to time) shall be applicable. For teachers of Art Education, Craft Education, Home Science, Work Education, etc. the existing eligibility norms prescribed by the State Governments and other school managements shall be applicable till such time the NCTE lays down the minimum qualifications in respect of such teachers.

- -:(6):4. The Candidates/aspirants who have completed 18 months D.El.Ed Course conducted by NIOS shall be eligible to sit in the TET-2022
- 5. The candidate should satisfy his/her eligibility before applying and shall be personally responsible in case he/she is not eligible to apply as per the given eligibility criteria. It is to be noted that if a candidate has been allowed to appear in the Teacher Eligibility Test it does not imply that the candidate's eligibility has been verified. It does not vest any right with the candidate for appointment. The eligibility shall be finally verified, by the concerned recruiting agency / appointing authority.
- Minimum percentage of marks in graduation shall not be applicable to those incumbents who had already taken admission to bachelor of Education or Bachelor of Elementary Education or equivalent course prior to the 29th July, 2011.
- The pass mark for TET 2022 is 60% for General candidates and 50% for OBC, ST, SC and Physically challenged candidates.

The candidates not having any of the above qualifications are not eligible to apply for appearing in Teacher Eligibility Test (TET).

PATTERN OF EXAMINATION:

The Teacher Eligibility Test will be of objective type Multiple Choice Question (MCQ's). There will be 2 papers of TET and there will be no negative marking. The time duration for the said Test/Examination shall be 2.30 hours/150 minutes.

Paper - I will be for a candidate who intends to be a teacher for classes I to V

Paper - II will be for a candidate who intends to be a teacher for classes VI to VIII.

NOTE: A person who intends to be a teacher for both levels (classes I to V and classes VI to VIII) has to appear in both the papers (Paper-I and Paper-II).
